CECRA Certification



- Pre requirement: Degree or completed vocational training and 2 years experience working as an adviser/consultant
- Complete 2 compulsory modules 1 & 2 and at least
 3 others from the 15 defined modules
- 3. Visit an **event in a different country**, at least 1 day
- 4. Complete an **exchange visit to another advisory service** in a different country, at least three days, with moderated knowledge sharing
- 5. Complete **end of programme project**Note **each module** requires a **minimum of 30 hours**study: 12 hours of tuition and 18 hours practical experience and private studies





CECRA+ 2015 + objectives

- The development of CECRA towards a European training and certification programme in extension method for practicing advisers and consultants in member organisations
- Providing a support system for training trainers and for accrediting/ approving course delivery
- Enabling advisers experience advisory systems in other countries
- Ensuring that the ethos and value of the training and certification are maintained and enhanced

Accreditation process for CECRA Regional Certification Bodies

The interested institution **applies for admission** as Regional Certification Body **to EUFRAS**.

EUFRAS forwards the application to IALB **CECRA-AG** with the request to give its **opinion**.

EUFRAS-Board decides in consideration of the recommendations of IALB CECRA-AG and EUFRAS CECRA Office on the recognition as Regional Certification Body and, if positive, **concludes a partnership agreement** in **coordination with IALB**.



Progress to Date

- Agreement signed in June 2015 between IALB and EUFRAS
- Two EUFRAS members (Latvia and Spain) applied to EUFRAS to become regional certification bodies
- Train the trainer workshop organised for Dublin, early October 2015
